Federal regulations require parents to have the primary responsibility to pay for a dependent student's educational expenses. None of the conditions listed below, singly or in combination, qualify as unusual circumstances meriting a dependency override:

- Parents refuse to contribute to the student's education
- Parents are unwilling to provide information on the FAFSA or for verification
- Parents do not claim the student as a dependent for income tax purposes
- Student demonstrates total self-sufficiency

Circumstances that may warrant a dependency override appeal may include but are not limited to:

- Abandonment or estrangement by parents or inability to locate parents
- Physical or emotional abuse by parents
- Victim of human trafficking
- Parental incarceration and contact with parent would pose a risk to the student
- Parental hospitalization for extended time or mental incapacitation
- Have refugee or asylee status and are separated from parents, or parents are displaced in a foreign country

ECC understands unusual circumstances occur and some students may have a unique family situation. If you believe you have an unusual or unique family situation, please complete this form and submit all required documents to the Financial Aid Office. Please note, all decisions are made at the discretion and professional judgment of the ECC Financial Aid Office. Submission of this form and supporting documents does not guarantee approval.

The law requires a determination of unusual circumstances for a dependency override be made each award year. A decision made in one award year does not automatically mean a student would be deemed independent in another year.

Students should be aware ECC is not required to perform dependency overrides, and if the financial aid administrator determines an override is not appropriate, the decision cannot be appealed.

- If selected for verification, provide all necessary documents for the Verification process, including but not limited to: a copy of your 2022 Federal Tax Return Transcript (if filed) and W-2's. If appealing due to becoming married, a copy of your spouse's 2022 Federal Tax Return Transcript (if filed) and a copy of all W-2's.
- Completed 2024-2025 Free Application for Federal Student Aid at [www.studentaid.gov](http://www.studentaid.gov). (ECC will process your FAFSA if this appeal is approved. If this appeal is denied, you must resubmit the FAFSA with your parent(s)' information.)

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### Acceptable Documentation

- Court Order or Official Federal or State documentation that the students' parents or legal guardian(s) are incarcerated
- A written statement from an attorney, guardian ad litem, a court-appointed special advocate (or similar), or a representative of a TRIO or GEAR UP program that confirms the circumstances
- A documented determination of independence made by a financial aid administrator at another institution in the same or prior away year
- Utility bills, health insurance, or other documents that demonstrate a separation from parents or legal guardians
- Written statement on official letterhead from a State, County or Tribal welfare agency
- Written statement on official letterhead from an independent living case worker who supports current and former foster youth with transition to adulthood
- Written statement on official letterhead from a public or private agency, facility, or program servicing the victims of abuse, neglect, assault, or violence

Dependency Petitions are considered incomplete if any documentation is missing and will not be reviewed. All documents should have your name, and ECC Student ID # included. Please allow up to 20 business days for processing. Attach all supporting documents to this form and submit in-person at the campus nearest you, or mail to:
