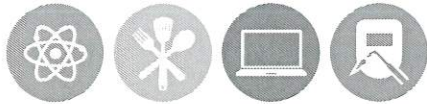
Volunteer Work Assignments

Reminders and more information:

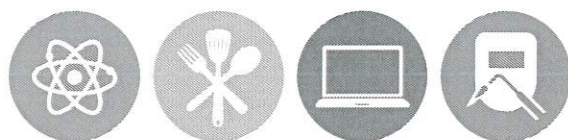
- Be sure that the students sign the roster during each class.

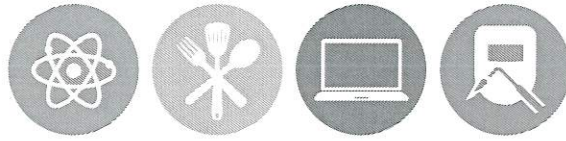
